

'The Gates of Hell', you come in".



in the future.



HAPPY NEW YEAR!

I hope you've had a good Christmas Day, and are enjoying the continuing Christmas season – in the church calendar we've got Epiphany next, the season of revelation – beginning with the visit of the wise men to Jesus, as well as exploring other revelations of Jesus – looking at both his humanity, and his divinity.

I don't know if there's such a genre as 'Epiphany Carols', but if there is, 'We three kings...' is a favourite for me. It works just as well for a church choir as it does in a pub (particularly when the 'O' at the start of the chorus gets longer with each verse!), and in its exploration of the Magi's gifts it really enters into the Epiphany spirit.

The gift of gold reveals Jesus as the King foretold in the Old Testament, long-awaited, and enthroned to rule forever over creation.

The gift of frankincense, temple spice, reveals Jesus as God – in existence since the beginning of creation, and forever at God's right hand.

The gift of myrrh reveals the future that awaits this baby born in a stable – a very human death despite his godly kingship. Myrrh points the way forward to the one who will suffer death, in order to conquer it once and for all.

My own 'Epiphany' came when I was a student at University, when I asked the question 'Who is Jesus?' and realised the significance of the answer.

I wonder what your epiphany was? Perhaps you didn't experience a single moment of revelation, but instead a slow growth in faith. Or perhaps, you haven't yet experienced your own epiphany...

Whatever your story, perhaps I can give you a challenge this Epiphany– to share your story. Whether that's telling someone what Jesus means to you, or sharing some of the questions you have about faith – let's share in revelation together.


A couple of times last year I was asked by the York and Scarborough NHS Trust chaplaincy team to visit a patient at St Monica's Hospital who had asked for someone to pray with them. Following these visits one of the chaplaincy team wondered if I would consider becoming a chaplaincy volunteer for St Monica's and, after some prayerful thought and an interview via Zoom, I decided to go ahead and apply.

Then followed references, DBS check, health questionnaire, on-line training and three in-class training sessions until finally I was awarded a maroon coloured polo shirt with 'NHS' on the front and 'volunteer' embroidered in large letters across the back. But that wasn't all; I had to have two supervised visits to the hospital with clergy from the chaplaincy team before they decided I was eligible to visit independently.

It has taken several months to put all this in place but I'm delighted to now be able to share God's love at St Monica's and by being part of the Trust's volunteer team I can visit, as a chaplain, all the patients at St Monica's and not just those from our parish.

*Lord God, we bring before you the staff and patients of St Monica's Hospital. We give thanks that this much needed facility is here in our community and ask that it continues to bring help and hope to all who need it long into the future.

THE CHILDREN'S SOCIETY

The **CHILDREN'S SOCIETY**, formerly known as The Church of England Children's Society, is a UK charity, allied to the Church of England. Its aims are to improve the lives of disadvantaged children and young people, and to create a positive shift in social attitudes towards them. We as a parish have supported it for many years both through direct donations, and through individual collection boxes which are held by parishioners and in which loose change can be collected.

In 2025 the Society has helped more than 57,000 young people across the country, running 40 early support services, group sessions, and one-to-one support where needed, and has provided safe and welcoming spaces without the need for long waiting lists and lengthy referral processes

If you wish to support this very worthwhile cause, collection boxes are available from me, or you can donate either on line at childrenssociety.org.uk , or by calling the Society direct on 0300 303 7000. Alternatively you can do so by post to The Children's Society, Octavia House, 50 Banner Street, London EC1Y 8ST. I have donation and gift aid forms, and would be happy to forward cheques, payable to The Children's Society, on your behalf if that's easier.

For those already holding boxes, we usually collect their contents in April and September each year, so if you have money to pay in, and would like me to collect it, do please let me know. If you prefer to contribute direct to the Children's Society, again please let me have details for our records.


They hope to bridge gaps where other services are not able to help, to support the isolated, listen to the lonely, comfort the bereaved and sit with the dying.

Why Not Pray?

In the parable of the judge and the widow (Luke 18:1-8) we learn something about prayer. The widow is persistent in her seeking justice and in the end the judge gives in and grants her request. If even such a disrespectful man can do the right thing in the end, how much more might our actual prayers affect the course of history, the course of our lives? Prayer changes us. If we don't lose heart, it's the way we keep seeking after God's own heart, the way we keep channels of communication open between us and God. The parable is a plea to keep praying, even when it seems we are shouting into a vacuum. It's a plea not to get stuck in hopelessness, but to keep going, keep trusting, keep praying. God is not the unjust judge. God is God, who hears our prayers and draws closer and closer to us through them. We might not know the best outcome as we move forward in life, but God does.

It includes periods of music and silent meditation



In today's culture this is an opportunity of being together in a reflective mood including silence. After a brief period of spoken reflection we experience some reflective music. We then enter a period of silent meditation for about 20-25 minutes. Some people use a 4-beat mantra such as "Ma-ra-na-tha" (or Come Lord Jesus), said twice, (not out loud!) breathing in and then when breathing out. After this, another period of music precedes a final prayer. It doesn't suit everyone but it is something worth trying. Sometimes we have a few comments, even laughter, afterwards! In today's busy-ness people often find this simple and yet cathartic. Even children in school use silence as a restful experience!

Perhaps, give it a try? Join us, you are most welcome.
