

*From the Vicar ...*



At the point of writing, the Coronavirus is beginning to take hold in the United Kingdom. At this stage we don't know what to expect; will it reach Easingwold and what will its effect be? We have uncertainty about what is going to happen in the future. We see panic buying of toilet rolls, painkillers and soap, just in case something happens.

The disciples must have experienced the panic and fear of not knowing what was going to happen to them during the trial of Jesus. Peter was probably the sort of person who would have bought mountains of toilet rolls if he was alive now. He behaved as many of us would do if we were in his situation. Jesus had warned Peter:

***"...this night, before the cock crow, thou shalt deny me thrice."***

Peter did not think that he would ever deny Jesus but he found himself in situations where he was scared for his own life. The cock did crow as Jesus said and Peter realised what he had done. Peter realised that he had thought about his own wellbeing rather than the wellbeing of others.

Bishop Alan of St Albans Diocese offers advice of four golden rules which are relevant in many situations, here is a summary;

**Golden Rule One:** Each one of us can think about how we can protect and support our neighbours.

**Golden Rule Two:** Think about who may be suffering more than me.

**Golden Rule Three:** Don't give into panic and start hoarding food.

**Golden Rule Four:** Live today to the full. None of us ever know what the future holds. In the Sermon on the Mount (Matthew 6. 25 – 34), Jesus challenged his followers to live each day fully and not be afraid. Every time we are tempted to give in to fear we need to make a conscious choice to respond in trust and openness.

Easter is about the thanksgiving and celebration of what Christ did for us. He overcame his fear for us by dying on the cross. It's a time for us to now rejoice in the Lord, and ask Him to help us overcome our fears by following His example and think of others.

Have a wonderful Easter rejoicing in the Lord.

## D.A.V.E.

(Dementia Awareness in the Villages and Easingwold)

In early March a training session was arranged by C.T.E.D. at which a representative from Dementia Forward gave an excellent illustrated talk about dementia: its frequency, its effect on the brain and its causes, its symptoms and ways of helping someone stricken with this illness and their carer.

Thirty three people representing nine groups (church and non-church) took advantage of this event and three churches are now recognised as dementia friendly. The aim is to enable all of Easingwold to be dementia friendly, so if you weren't able to attend this meeting watch out for the next. The training, only one hour, really was a most helpful.

## ELECTORAL ROLL

Every parish in the Church of England is required to maintain an Electoral Roll (ER), which is a list of all those lay persons who are entitled to vote in elections (for example in the election of Churchwardens and the PCC).

It is updated annually, and to maintain currency, a complete new Electoral Roll is compiled every six years. A new ER was completed accordingly last year, and a copy is displayed on the notice-boards of both churches, together with blank election forms.

# St John the Baptist Men's Group

The Men's Group last met on Tuesday 10<sup>th</sup> of March when the speaker for the evening was Rev Dr Gavin Wakefield, Director of Mission and Ministry for the Diocese of York. Gavin spoke about the history of the Church of England, and was also able to share what the Church of England is currently doing in the York Diocese through new initiatives to reach out to various age and social groups.

There are two key initiatives:

Firstly, the establishment of some 14 new posts across the region to try and engage with the missing generation of churchgoers (those between the ages of 20 and 40 years).

Secondly, the establishment of some 7 posts, the holders of which will be tasked with addressing problems experienced by those who live in our most deprived areas.

Gavin's talk stimulated lengthy discussions, and many questions were raised in relation to these initiatives, and also their implications for the established parish churches across the Diocese as a whole.

At the time of writing, in light of the situation regarding the Coronavirus, and expected political announcements regarding 'social distancing' and 'self isolating', I have decided to suspend the Men's Group until further notice.

Hopefully the meetings will resume in the summer. In the meantime, keep safe and watch this space.


