

From Rev'd Richard Grant



As Easter approaches and Lent comes to an end I'm very much looking forward to the festivity of Easter (and the approach of some warmer weather...), but I'm also going to miss our Lent Course. Over the past few weeks, a number of us have gathered to reflect on and discuss a number of topics and it has been a delight to get stuck into some deep conversations and debates. One of my favourite sessions, and certainly one which continues to make me ponder, was our discussion about 'Sharing the Scriptures'.

For some, reading the bible is a daily delight, for others, an occasional chore. Some have a well thumbed bible, others prefer to use an app which provides daily readings. (The 'Lectio 365' app got many recommendations.) I think we can agree that there's some wonderful encouragement in the bible, but there are some difficult parts too! One thing we definitely seemed to agree on was that the bible is not like other books: Starting at the beginning is not necessarily the best way to read it! If you're someone who feels they'd like to read the bible more, or if you've always meant to and never quite got there, let me invite you now to start afresh. If you want a recommendation, I'd go for the Gospel of John (but other opinions are available). If you do pick up a bible for the first time, or for the first time in a while, please do let me know – I'd love to encourage you in that journey, and to hear your experiences of exploring God's scriptures.

One other gem which I've been reintroduced to through our Lent Course has been this poem by the 16th century priest George Herbert. As we prepare to mark Christ's death and resurrection at Easter, we remember that his sacrifice was for every one of us, and his love cleanses every one of us from our sins. Let me leave you with these words about that gift of Easter – put much better than I could put them.

*LOVE bade me welcome; yet my soul drew back,
Guilty of dust and sin.
But quick-eyed Love, observing me grow slack
From my first entrance in,
Drew nearer to me, sweetly questioning
If I lack'd anything.
'A guest,' I answer'd, 'worthy to be here:'
Love said, 'You shall be he.'
'I, the unkind, ungrateful? Ah, my dear,
I cannot look on Thee.'
Love took my hand and smiling did reply,
Who made the eyes but I?'
'Truth, Lord; but I have marr'd them: let my shame
Go where it doth deserve.'
'And know you not,' says Love, 'Who bore the blame?'
My dear, then I will serve.'
'You must sit down,' says Love, 'and taste my meat.'
So I did sit and eat.*





One of many ways to pray

There are many ways we can pray and there are wonderful resources available. Continuing from last month, remember, each prayer focus for your thumb and each finger could itself open up into prayer personally, locally, nationally and globally:.



"As God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, meekness and patience". (Colossians 3:12) and let your thumb and each finger represent one of these "clothes" we are to put on.

- ♦ Thumb - compassion
- ♦ First finger - kindness
- ♦ Second finger - humility
- ♦ Third finger - meekness
- ♦ Little finger - patience

When you pray, put your hands together and let the "clothing" of one hand touch the people, places in the other, and see what God does.

Maybe prayer like this could be part of our daily rhythm. However we pray, it is the Lord who meets us in listening and speaking.

BOOK REVIEW

I recently read a book written as an Advent Book, but it can be read at any time - "Listening to the Music of the Soul" by the Bishop of Chelmsford, Guli Francis-Dehqani. It is an easy book to read but is informative and thought-provoking.

In one chapter, Bishop Guli said that she had attended a conference at which she had been impressed by a talk by Professor Hartmut Rosa. He presented those attending with a picture of the ideologies that have shaped the capitalism of Western democracies – the notions of progress and growth, aggressive competition, dominance and power.


To succeed in this environment, he says, it becomes impossible to keep pace with competitors, and in the process the planet is being destroyed. Individuals are being crushed by unbearable and unreasonable pressures. Professor Rosa advocates that instead of struggling to keep pace, we should develop a model based on "resonance". "This relates to a space in which to engage with others whose ideas are different, to learn and adapt, to reflect and appreciate, to connect more deeply and allow for the possibility of transformation".

He suggests that the Church already has these spaces. He reminds us that this is the Church's vocation – not to be large and successful, not to be anxious about the future, not to heap pressure on the clergy and congregations to grow and increase in size, but to be a place where all are welcome; where we gather together as Christ's body to pray, worship, learn and serve our local community

In resonance spaces, he suggests, we can cultivate the art of silence, learn to live less anxious lives and engage together in exploring those unanswered questions that invite us to step deeper into our understanding of God's love, justice, judgement and mercy.

This reflection, which came in the last of eight chapters, spoke to me at this particular time in our history, but all the way through I found pearls of wisdom to consider.

Perhaps you might too.



In today's culture this is an opportunity of being together in a reflective mood including silence. After a brief period of spoken reflection we experience some reflective music. We then enter a period of silent meditation for about 20-25 minutes. Some people use a 4-beat mantra such as "Ma-ra-na-tha" (or Come Lord Jesus), said twice, (not out loud!) breathing in and then when breathing out. After this, another period of music precedes a final prayer. It doesn't suit everyone but it is something worth trying. Sometimes we have a few comments, even laughter, afterwards! In today's busy-ness people often find this simple and yet cathartic. Even children in school use silence as a restful experience!
