

Perhaps it would be better to understand the Bible text as meaning that no matter what happens to us, God can be trusted and relied upon, that even when we are unfaithful, he is not. We can never be quite sure when spring will begin, but we can be sure it will come. God will always be there for us, even when we try to keep him at a distance.

Happy birthday Laurence Sterne!

Laurence Sterne was born in Clonmel, Co. Tipperary on 24 November 1713, making this year the 300th anniversary of his birth and a cause for celebration.

But what is there about this man that we should celebrate? His reputation is certainly chequered and somewhat controversial. The Life and Opinions of Tristram Shandy, Gentleman is one of the most brilliant, extraordinary, comical, poetic, philosophical and entertaining novels in the history of English literature, so perhaps that's one good reason to hang out the bunting. But should a vicar be writing a novel that begins with a confession by the hero that the troubles and misfortunes of his life are a direct result of his parents' lack of concentration at the point of his conception?

His sermons, delivered in the churches of Sutton-on-the-Forest, Stillington, Coxwold, York Minster, St. Michael-le-Belfrey and in London and Paris are fascinating insights into the language of the 3-decker pulpit and the box-pew. The fact that he used a pseudonym to promote the sales of his sermons is perhaps questionable. When first offered on sale in London the sermons were advertised as being written by 'Mr Yorick', the fictional parson in Tristram Shandy. Should a vicar be promoting his sermons using a fictional identity? Is this proper?

On his grave-marker, transported from London and now in the porch of the church in Coxwold, it is recorded that V Was a trices who smoked and drank grog.



'Sterne was the man, who, with gigantic stride / Mow'd down luxuriant follies far and wide.' The inscription goes on to tell us that, despite his intelligence and his understanding of human nature, he was 'Ridicul'd, abus'd / By fools insulted, and by prudes accus'd'.
