



From the Vicar



This month we celebrate an event that most of us have never experienced before, the Coronation of a new Monarch. King Charles III lived a full life and had many experiences before becoming king, I hope that this will make him a leader who is able to heal divisions that exist within society.

Many years ago he said that he would be defender of faiths when he became king; we have a Hindu Prime Minister, a Muslim First Minister of Scotland (the first Muslim leader of Western Europe in recent times) with whom he will need to work while being Head of the Church of England.

We are living in a world that is becoming more secular. The secular world is using Christian values but taking God out of it. I am very at ease with people from other faiths, I have worked professionally with many people of different faiths when I worked in the Ophthalmology Departments in the mill towns of Lancashire. It was lovely to share in some of their celebrations such as Diwali, when they would bring in festival foods for us to try. They would join in with eating chocolate and sending Christmas cards at Christmas time. It was a very diverse group of people but joining in each other's celebrations helped unite the department against any racial prejudices that we came across in the patients.

As Christians, we have recently celebrated the most important Christian festival of Easter. Christ died and rose again for us, but Jesus is also a highly regarded prophet in the Muslim faith. If Charles can lead this nation, with its many different nationalities, cultures and religions, helping his subjects feel that they are British then that would be great.

I remember the riots in Oldham, I was working there at the time, Bangladeshi against Pakistani, and both groups against the white population. I was never threatened or ever felt threatened. I would ask my patients about how they were surviving Ramadan and most were surprised that I was aware of it. I was invited to numerous Eid parties because of my interest in them but had to decline as they were patients. I hope and pray that Charles takes his Christian duties seriously, and I hope that his understanding and acceptance of other faiths means that future riots are less likely to happen.

The Jews were surprised when Jesus told parables of the Good Samaritan. According to the Jewish people, the Samaritans did not understand God in the way that they ought to, yet these people were seen as the caring and forgiving bunch. In the last century Christians were responsible for the Holocaust, what would our God think of that? Do we need to look at ourselves and see if we are like the Jews who don't want anything to do with the Samaritans or are we accepting of other people and their faiths?

Our brains are designed to believe in a greater being, so in many ways I struggle far more with atheists than I do with those of a different faith. We have a portion of the brain that has developed to believe, in the same way that we have feet that have developed to walk but we don't deny our feet, why should people deny their faith? But they do!

Only time will tell if Charles is a good leader. The Christian faith was central to his mother's realm, and he has been brought up as a Christian, so I do hope that he lives and expresses his faith in an appropriate manner so that people come to understand God's glory through the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. At the same time, I hope and pray that he helps those of other faiths feel British and valued, the majority believe in the same God as us.

May God bless us and King Charles III



Christian Meditation

Most Fridays at 2.30 pm to 3.15 pm at the Galtres Centre Function Room

It includes periods of music and silent meditation



In today's culture this is an opportunity of being together in a reflective mood including silence. After a brief period of spoken reflection we experience some reflective music. We then enter a period of silent meditation for about 20-25 minutes. Some people use a mantra such as "Maranatha" (Come Lord Jesus). This has 4 beats and fits a breathing in and out (said twice). Others, or no mantras, are used - but not spoken. After this, another period of music precedes a final prayer. It doesn't suit everyone but it is something worth trying. Sometimes we have a few comments, even laughter, afterwards! In today's busy-ness people often find this simple and yet cathartic. Even children in school use silence as a restful experience!

Perhaps, give it a try? Join us, you are most welcome.
