

From the Vicar



"But Peter, standing with the eleven, raised his voice and addressed them: 'Men of Judea and all who live in Jerusalem, let this be known to you, and listen to what I say. Indeed, these are not drunk, as you suppose, for it is only nine o'clock in the morning."

Acts 2 14-16

Peter was speaking to a crowd after he had received the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. He was energised and proclaiming God's word in a world in which the authorities wanted him dead. People had come together in the market place to listen to Peter, and were being amazed at what he said. The Holy Spirit gave Peter the confidence and the words to stand up and speak rather than hiding away in the upper room.

At Ascension, we heard how Jesus had been taken to heaven. The cloud came down, hiding Jesus from the disciples. When the cloud cleared, Jesus had disappeared and the disciples were left with two angels. These angels saw the disciples looking upwards at the sky and so they asked why were they still looking for Jesus up there. The disciples now had Jesus' work to do but they had to wait for the gift of God at Pentecost before they could begin. It was the start of the church, it was in the market place. Peter was living his faith in the community.

There were thousands of acts of people living their faith over the recent Coronation weekend, King Charles being the main focus. There were street parties with people in towns and villages coming together to have a great time. It was a huge success.

Here in Easingwold, we had our own street parties with the town's-people coming together for an afternoon of fun and laughter. I was mad enough to go into the stocks along with Deputy Lord Lieutenant David Kenworthy, Easingwold Town Mayor Peter Nottage and our local MP Kevin Hollinrake. Young and old came together to enjoy the sunshine and each other's company whilst playing games or taking part in the dog show. Shops and businesses had decorated the fronts of buildings and red, white and blue could be seen everywhere. After the years of Covid with all of its restrictions, it was good to see people together again.

As a church we are providing opportunities to join together with the You and Me group. May saw a trip to the Sutton Bank Centre with more events planned throughout the year. There will be a further opportunity to join together when the Bishop of Selby comes to take our service on 25th June with a "bring and share" lunch afterwards. There will be more details about this in church nearer the time.

Jesus sent the gift of the Holy Spirit out of love for humanity. Coming together, seeing one another and being supportive is a great way to show God's love in our lives. I hope that you are able to join in the events that will take place. The one following the Bishop's visit will be an opportunity to join with families for an afternoon picnic. Special Commemorative Service Celebrating the Coronation of His Majesty King Charles III

On Sunday 7th May at Easingwold Church, there was a well attended special service led by Margaret to commemorate the Coronation of His Majesty King Charles III. Also in attendance were Deputy Lieutenant of North Yorkshire David Kenworthy, Easingwold Town Mayor Peter Nottage, and MP for Thirsk and Malton Kevin Hollinrake.

The service began with organ music from JS Bach's 'Prelude and Fugue in E Flat Major' and a procession of standards by Jim Cartwright and Andrea Jones from the Royal British Legion, and Saima Bennett from the Air Training Corp.

Old and New Testament readings were delivered by Alan Burroughs and David Kenworthy. Margaret gave a light hearted and celebratory sermon with examples of possible gifts to our new monarch to reflect on his new life of duty and service to the nation.

Intercession Prayers were led by Benjamin Lynam representing both the young people and the other churches in Easingwold. There was an enthusiastic singing of hymns, the anthem 'O Taste and See', a beautifully sung solo by Alex Cranfield, and everyone joining in the National Anthem.

The service concluded with a rousing rendition of William Walton's Crown Imperial (composed for the Coronation of King George VI in 1937) played by Peter Smith.



It includes periods of music and silent meditation



In today's culture this is an opportunity of being together in a reflective mood including silence. After a brief period of spoken reflection we experience some reflective music. We then enter a period of silent meditation for about 20-25 minutes. Some people use a mantra such as "Maranatha" (Come Lord Jesus). This has 4 beats and fits a breathing in and out (said twice). Others, or no mantras, are used - but not spoken. After this, another period of music precedes a final prayer. It doesn't suit everyone but it is something worth trying. Sometimes we have a few comments, even laughter, afterwards! In today's busy-ness people often find this simple and yet cathartic. Even children in school use silence as a restful experience!

Perhaps, give it a try? Join us, you are most welcome.
