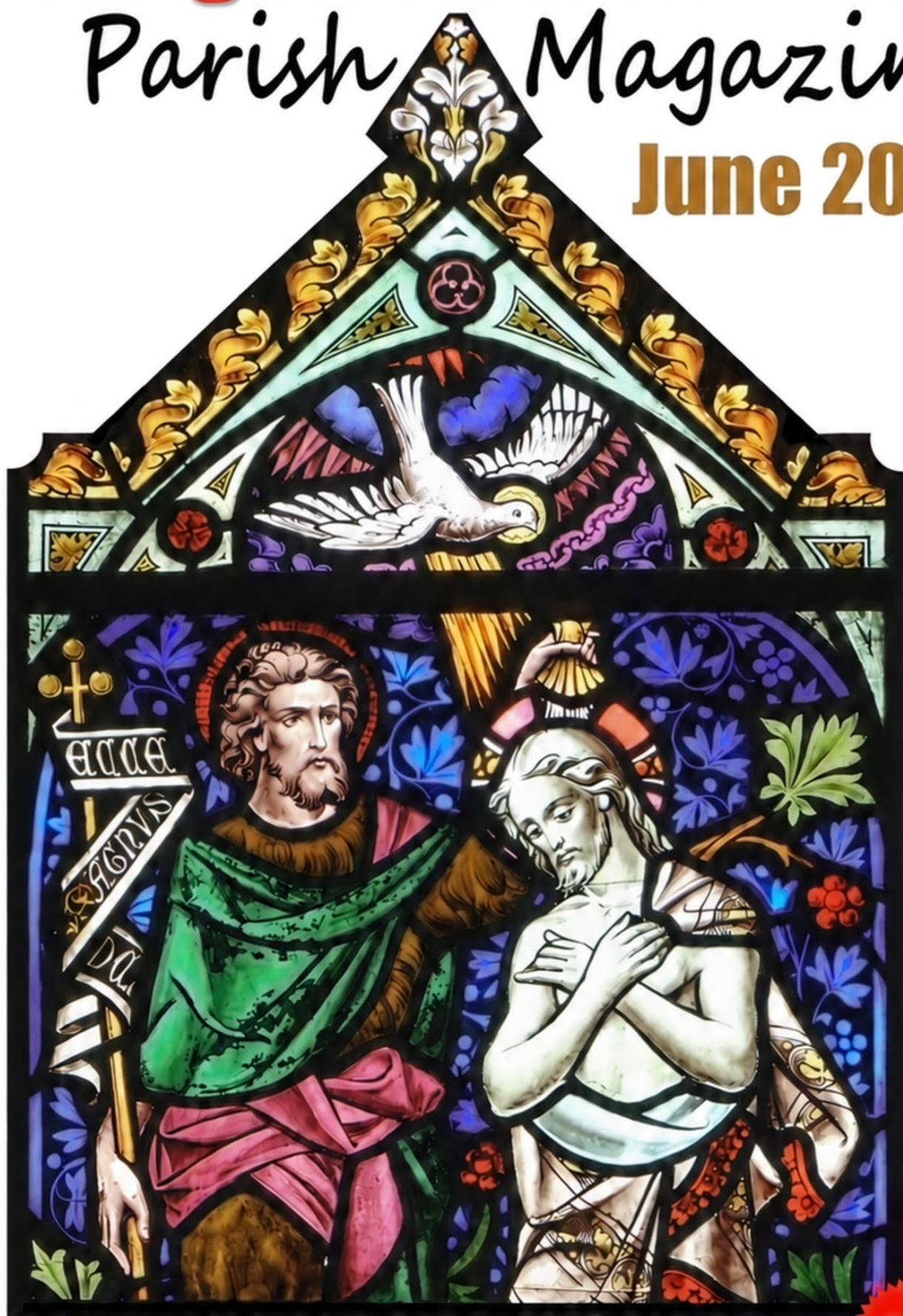

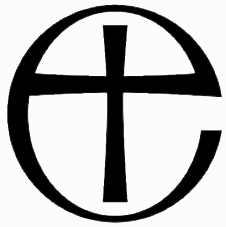

Greetings from the vicarage!

I've enjoyed May very much – we've welcomed some of you to the vicarage for tea and cake, we had a wonderful evening of cheese, wine and quizzing at Easingwold church, we've had a fab ceilidh at Raskelf, I've made a tentative return to running, and I've even squeezed in a few days away as well.

Another highlight has been planting fruit trees in the garden. One tree we put in the ground is an apple tree we brought with us. We've had it six years now, and I think we've had just two apples from it in that time, which is a little disappointing. We've also put in a new plum and a cherry. I hope that we'll see more fruit, more quickly from those two, but even if we don't, I'm confident that it's worth putting them in. I know that, in time, there will be fruit from those trees and that others will hopefully enjoy it. I think we all do many good things that we might never see the fruit of, and sometimes things that we know we will never see the fruit of – and I think that's a distinctly Christian attitude. I think of it whenever someone asks me how long our churches took to build - it probably took lifetimes, those who began building them were likely dead before they were finished. They were truly committed to working for a future they would never see, and we continue to taste the fruit of their labours centuries later.

In our modern world, which so often feels focussed on instant results and personal gain, it can feel very difficult to plant for the future – modern culture might have us believe we deserve to see the fruits of our labour. However, our faith reminds us that we live only by grace and that the true reward is treasure in heaven, not on earth.

The letter to the Hebrews reminds us that many faithful people did not receive the things promised in their lifetimes, yet continued trusting God. They lived in faith, their obedience becoming a blessing for future generations. Like them, we will never know the full impact of our prayers, of our encouragement, of our testimony, of our service – but God does know, and we lay up treasure in heaven with Him. God brings the growth from the seeds we may never see blossom ourselves.

So let us continue planting in faith, planting hope where there is despair, kindness where there is bitterness, faith where there is doubt. The harvest belongs to God, and future generations will one day give thanks for seeds quietly and faithfully planted today.

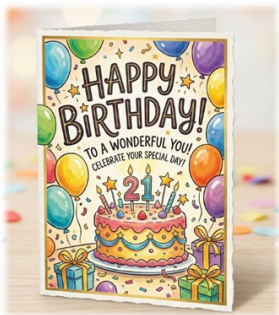

The other day I was sitting with a pile of blank birthday cards in front of me as I began the process of making sure I had enough to send to family and friends over the coming month. This started me thinking: why do we celebrate birthdays and send cards?

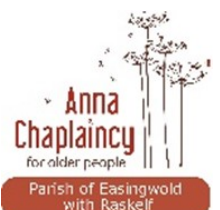
Evidence has been found on Hadrian's Wall showing that the Romans recognized and celebrated birthdays as significant 'life' milestones and the book of Genesis mentions a Pharaoh's birthday celebration (Genesis 40:20-22) but all this wasn't possible until the invention of the calendar and even then it was only the noble ranks who had their place in society marked and celebrated.

It wasn't until the 19<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup> centuries and a significant change in social and economic lifestyles that it became possible and increasingly important to celebrate a child's milestones from birth through to adulthood and beyond to old age.

Personally, I look forward to receiving birthday cards but I have a suspicion that the younger generation are not quite so bothered as those of us who grew up marking milestones and keeping in touch by post rather than social media.

### Prayer – A conversation with God

If you've thought about praying but don't know where to start here's a simple guide to get you started.

Prayer in its simplest form is a conversation with God and just as with any conversation someone has to get it going and that someone is 'you'. The conversation can be out loud or in your head, either way, you will be heard.

**Start small:** Don't worry if your prayer isn't perfect or your mind wanders a bit as you go along. Start with a single sentence such as "Lord, I need you to help me".

**Anywhere, Anytime:** Pray when you feel the time is right for you. Doing the chores, out walking or just sitting in silence. Some people like to have a daily routine for prayer but if that doesn't suit your lifestyle, pray when you can.

**What do I say?:** Tell God what's on your mind. Your worries and concerns may be the first things you think of but you can also thank God for the good things in your life, he wants to hear both. Say as much or as little as you feel you need to, you will not be judged.

**Closure:** Thank God for being with you and listening.

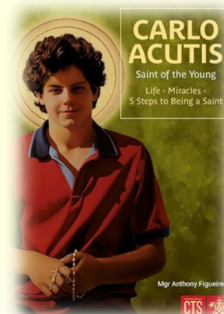

## BOOK REVIEW

Following the review on 'Listening to the Music of the Soul' submitted by Chris which appeared in our April magazine, one of our subscribers, Freda Waite of St John the Evangelist RC church, has kindly sent this review of a book which she has recently read.

*During Lent I have been reading 'Carlo Acutis - Saint of the Young' written by Mgr Anthony Figueiredo. Carlo has become the first Roman Catholic Millennial Saint. He was born on 3<sup>rd</sup> May 1991 in London, then his family moved to Milan. He died on 12<sup>th</sup> October 2006 of Leukaemia. His beatification took place in Assisi on 10<sup>th</sup> October 2020 and, on the 7<sup>th</sup> September 2025, Carlo was canonised by Pope Leo XIV.*

*Carlo had the ability to integrate his faith with modern technology. He was a skilled computer programmer. He managed to do this whilst remaining committed to prayer and devotion, earning him the title 'Saint of the Young'. Carlo would say: "Why do people worry so much about the beauty of their own body and not about the beauty of the soul?" Chris's choice of book, 'Listening to the Music of the Soul' was also a good reminder of this.*

*In today's culture this is an opportunity of being together in a reflective mood including silence. After a brief period of spoken reflection we experience some reflective music. We then enter a period of silent meditation for about 20-25 minutes. Some people use a 4-beat mantra such as 'Ma-ra-na-tha' (or Come Lord Jesus), said twice, (not out loud!) breathing in and then when breathing out. After this, another period of music precedes a final prayer. It doesn't suit everyone but it is something worth trying. Sometimes we have a few comments, even laughter, afterwards! In today's busyness people often find this simple and yet cathartic. Even children in school use silence as a restful experience!*
