

Despite this, many mad people took the challenge of swimming for charity. I wasn't the fastest, but I certainly wasn't the slowest, I came about 2/3rds of the way through the group that I was swimming with, so I was quite happy.

I chose to take this challenge and was sponsored for it, (many thanks to everyone who sponsored me), but it made me think of the millions of people who have to endure some chronic medical condition and wake up each day to what can seem like an insurmountable challenge. For those of you who live with a chronic illness, you will remember the early days of diagnosis when you woke up every morning and for that split second everything was fine and then it hit you. You had to deal with it day after day until it became part of your life.

We suffer simply because we live in an imperfect world and "bad things happen". But Isaiah 41:13 tells us,

"For I am the LORD your God who takes hold of your right hand and says to you, 'Do not fear; I will help you'."

Sometimes in the depth of despair, it can feel that God has left us, but He hasn't. We have the confidence that whatever challenges come our way, God is with us to guide us, and lead us. We don't know which direction He is going to lead us, and we may find that we have further challenges along the way.

The summer weather is challenging most people at the moment, here's hoping for a few days of sunshine before the autumn sets in!

Parish Visit to Iona



On the 18th May, a group of 23 comprising Easingwold Church members and a few people from churches further afield arrived on the beautiful Isle of Iona for a 7 night stay at Bishop's House retreat.

With the tiny chapel of St. Columba at its heart, the house has been described as a place of "prayer, study, contemplation and Eucharist". Daily Eucharist and evening Compline services in the chapel were well attended by our group and by residents and other visitors to the island. Margaret was the resident Chaplain for the week but, with 13 services in the chapel over 7 days, grateful thanks for leadership must go to the Revd. David Senior, Carole Senior, Revd. Greg Forster, Revd. Charlotte Cranfield, Revd. Lynne Connolly, Tony Young, Nancy Kilburn and Margaret Price.

One evening, 12 of us reviewed the book "Christianity Rediscovered" by Vincent Donovan, a story of how one man brought a number of Masai people in East Africa to Christian faith (a copy of this book has been placed in the prayer desk in Easingwold church).

Much of our time was spent walking the hills and beaches, painting and drawing, bird watching, a boat trip to Staffa to see Fingal's Cave, the seals and the puffins, or just relaxing with a book, taking in the beautiful tranquil scenery and listening to the Corncrakes, Oystercatchers and much more of the wildlife. Two intrepid members of our group even went swimming in the sea! Fortunately, the weather was mostly very good and much time was spent outdoors in the sunshine and fresh sea air. At the end of each day we enjoyed a lovely homely meal prepared by the staff at Bishop's House.

For such a tiny island it has an unparalleled draw for people of faith and no faith from all around the world; with hundreds visiting each day to spend a few short hours experiencing the island's spiritual warmth. They come to Iona for their own personal reasons, perhaps to escape the pressures of modern life, to find peace of mind and meaning to their life, to refresh their faith or simply out of curiosity.



The week in Iona was deemed a great success by our group and, despite the tiring journey involved, there was a real sense of reward, restoration and fulfilment from the island's peace, tranquillity and its uplifting sensation.

She first spoke about a group in Uganda which had already held parenting groups and which then decided to proceed by involving all their church community. The name of Eagle was adopted to indicate they were flying high. As a result local resources were improved such as the use of land, improving health and sanitation by building latrines. Women were much more involved in the decisions.

Hilary then went on to tell us about a young couple from York who were struggling financially after one of them lost his job and so were in danger of losing their flat. They were given a holiday in the MU caravan in Filey. This gave them some respite and soon after both were in employment.

The collection was in aid of the Literacy and Development project.

We will be holding an Afternoon Tea on August 10th, so we hope for a good number of customers to support us.



The image on the front cover is a composite of two images: The Apostles in Prayer (ca. 1400, South Netherlandish, Metropolitan Museum of Art); an oak relief depicting an episode from Our Lord's final appearance, following the Resurrection, when He revealed Himself to the apostles gathered in prayer. The other image is the Celtic Cross of Iona. Allan combined the two images to produce a single image that represents topics and ideas covered in this issue. One link to consider here is the Christian faith which the first century apostles started spreading throughout the world that later reached and started spreading through this land from the small Isle of Iona.



Online Donations



Visitors to our website easingwoldraskelfanglican.org will now see the option to make donations to the Parish via the secure payments portal **give.net**. We have registered with Stewardship, an organisation that has been providing advice, guidance, inspiration and practical tools to churches, secular and Christian charities since 1906.

This is a new venture for us that could provide an additional stream of income. Donations between £1 and £1,000,000 can be made although the higher amount is perhaps a little too optimistic! Give.net will collect the donation, for a small fee of 3%, claim the Gift Aid automatically and transfer the monies to the church's bank account. The Church of England has been promoting a "digital conversion" with cashless donations being available in parishes. Some churches are now allowing contactless card payments due to the declining numbers of people carrying cash. One step at a time!
