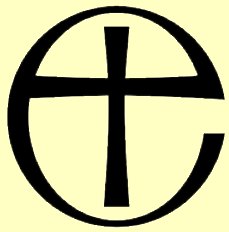

D-DAY REMEMBERED IN EASINGWOLD

On Saturday 8th June, the sacrifice of Allied troops and the efforts of the free world were remembered on the 80th Anniversary of the D-Day landings in Normandy.

Organised by the Easingwold Branch of the Royal British Legion members John Walker, John Cleaver and the Vicar of Easingwold, Rev'd Margaret Young, there was a short service of remembrance and laying of wreaths at the War Memorial in Easingwold Market Place.

Besides a sizeable gathering of local people, in attendance were Peter Nottage (Mayor of Easingwold), David Kenworthy (Deputy Lieutenant of North Yorkshire), and Jim Cartwright, John Sutherland, Andy Waller, Phil Birkinshaw, Ian Peel, Rachael Blueman, Peter Coomer and Isaac Levitt (readers, wreath layers, standard bearer and musicians).

A poignant moment in the proceedings was listening to the words of BBC newsreader John Snagg in London reading Communique Number 1 announcing the landing of troops on the beaches of Normandy earlier that morning on the 6th June 1944. A very personal final tribute was given by John Walker about his father's involvement in the Normandy campaign, his father very soon to celebrate his 101st birthday and being unable to attend the acts of remembrance.

HOW AND WHY DO WE PRAY?

WHAT OPPORTUNITIES DO WE HAVE TO PRAY?

It has come to our attention that “Prayer”, when we talk about it in church or in the magazine, can be somewhat confusing! It isn’t Prayer itself that confuses us, for we are told that we should “pray as we can, and not as we can’t”. Each individual will pray in their own way. However, there are so many things that we feel we need to pray about. We want to give thanks; to say we are sorry; to intercede for others as well as for ourselves. Praying builds our relationship with God, through Jesus. It is something we can all do. We don’t need particular skills, and for once age doesn’t matter! As well as individual prayer, praying together is also important – “When two or three are gathered together in my name, I will grant their requests.”

When we pray our own personal prayers, perhaps we can enlarge our vision a little by being prompted to pray for things we might not have thought of - in our church, the Church, our communities, the wider world.

There are several ways of doing this:

The Community Magazine Prayer Corner published in the magazine which offers four ideas for each month, and covers the whole of Raskelf and Easingwold each year.

The Parish Prayer Cycle, praying for our Vicar and the many people who are involved in a multitude of different ways.

The Prayer Group which is a small group of people (it could be larger) who pray confidentially for those who ask for prayer for a particular need

Churches Together in Easingwold Monthly Prayer Meeting (CTAE) who come together on the second Saturday each month at 9.00am, at The New Inn (Morning Coffee Afternoon Tea), to pray for Christianity in this area as well as the many wider issues there are today.

Two Castles and a cake!

This is the big one! We are delighted to confirm that the AFHS 2024 Autumn meeting, AGM and 40th Anniversary Celebrations will be held in the wonderful surroundings of Walworth Castle, County Durham, where the first ever meeting was held some 40 years ago. The event will feature displays of AFHS memorabilia, videos of relevant interesting events connected to our past, a series of illustrated short talks outlining the past, present and future of the Society, a talk by an Alderson with Royal connections including the cutting of an Anniversary Cake and the planting of a tree to commemorate the special occasion! In addition to the opportunity to stay in a genuine 11th Century Castle and enjoy a guided tour of the dungeons, there will be a Group Dinner and plenty of time for socialising with our friends and family. (Even though this may sound like a rather grand affair, please note the dress code is 'smart casual', rather than formal).

As we are returning customers, we have been able to secure discounted rates for a group booking at Walworth Castle. The rates are; For Friday, 6th Sept., Standard double or twin on a dinner, bed and breakfast basis, £146 per room for two guests and £125 per room for single occupancy.

For Saturday 7th Sept., Standard double or twin on bed and breakfast basis. £109 per room for two guests and £99 per room for single occupancy. Please note, the Three course Group Dinner will be held on the Saturday evening and will be charged for separately. Upgraded rooms are available at the following surcharges: Four Poster room, £40 per night. Four poster suites, £60 per night.

There has already been considerable interest in this event, and we recommend an early reservation be made with the hotel and return of the booking slip to be completed by 26th July to avoid disappointment.

There are a number of alternative venues for accommodation available in the surrounding area, ranging from B & B's, Guest Houses, Hotels, Holiday Cottages or Caravan/Camping Parks! Should you choose to stay elsewhere, or live locally, you will still be most welcome to join us at Walworth for the event and evening meals. Please see booking form to reserve a space.

Additionally, should anyone NOT staying in the Hotel at Walworth Castle wish to join us for Dinner on the Friday evening, please let me know by email so that I can make the necessary arrangements.



In today's culture this is an opportunity of being together in a reflective mood including silence. After a brief period of spoken reflection we experience some reflective music. We then enter a period of silent meditation for about 20-25 minutes. Some people use a 4-beat mantra such as "Ma-ra-na-tha" (or Come Lord Jesus), said twice, (not out loud!) breathing in and then when breathing out. After this, another period of music precedes a final prayer. It doesn't suit everyone but it is something worth trying. Sometimes we have a few comments, even laughter, afterwards! In today's busy-ness people often find this simple and yet cathartic. Even children in school use silence as a restful experience!
