

## *From the Vicar ...*



The world is gradually becoming more and more online. Recent months have encouraged many people to keep in contact with family and friends through the computer. How far will this go? What about if we had our holidays online? Our computers could go to the webcams on the beach, we could watch and hear the sea lashing on the rocks. Or we could have virtual tours of a house, with views out of the window looking at beautiful green fields or mountains. We could change our location on a daily basis flitting from seaside to inland on a whim giving us a multi-location holiday. We would be almost there but not quite, something would not be right; we would miss the clear air in our lungs or the smell of the sea and the feel of the warm air. It made me think that it would be like life without Christ, something is missing. Without Christ where would the hope be for our future? Who would forgive us when we do something wrong? Who would teach us about loving our neighbours as ourselves, when our neighbours could include those against us?

Modern technology has its advantages. It is possible that we won't need to come out on a cold, icy evening to attend a PCC meeting to sit in a cold draughty church when we can be in the warmth and safety of our own homes and see each other online to discuss what needs to be discussed. This idea of seeing each other was part of the sci-fi programmes of the 1970s, when the telephone was the quickest form of communication. The idea of looking at a screen to see people seemed as likely as Frankenstein building his monster. It is lovely to see everyone but it will be even better to see people in person and give them a hug.

Even though our lives have become more virtual, Christ is there for us in all that we do. He had not left us during social distancing. He is there as we go about our lives and we are far more enriched with His presence. God is with us, as Paul said in his letter to the Colossians

In this month of August, we can be assured that Christ is with us, as He has been throughout the lockdown in our good times and our bad.

Weddings and funerals are permitted but with limited numbers and social distancing

# St John the Baptist Men's Group

TO BOLDLY GO BEYOND WHERE NOBODY HAS GONE BEYOND BEFORE  
[OR SOMETHING LIKE THAT]

*[I was never really a Star Trek fan – but hopefully you get the gist of the line above]*

Have you missed 'attending church' in a physical sense over the past four months?

If you have, what is it that you have missed most during that time?

- ◇ Is it being in the building that we often call 'The Church'?
- ◇ Is it the physical meeting with others?
- ◇ Is it the act of Communion – actually receiving the bread and the wine?
- ◇ Is it the music and singing of hymns?
- ◇ Is it the opportunity to pray with others as we journey forward in faith?

It could be one or all of these things that we may have missed, and the desire to get back to normal is something that probably burns in the hearts of all of us.

But what do we actually mean by normal? Is it a case of getting back to the pattern of life which we were generally happy with, a pattern that allowed us to feel we were in control of things, that we could manage things in the way that best suited us, that made us feel most comfortable.

Perhaps we really are control-freaks - to coin a common term used of many people who live in the western world of the 21<sup>st</sup> century.

As much as we may want to simply get back to normal church, back within our comfort zones, we need to realise that this will not be as easy as we think, for two reasons:

- ◇ First, we are not over this pandemic yet, and many people in the scientific world fully expect another peak of infections in the late autumn/early winter. This may well lead to the closing of public facilities again – including church buildings.
- ◇ Secondly, the pandemic has created major economic uncertainty within the Church, at both Parish and Diocesan level. A direct consequence of this for parishes will be a need to review how they operate, to take stock of their ministry and work out what the priorities are in the coming months and years. It will be extremely important that those priorities reflect mission rather than maintenance, future vision rather than the status quo, and the values of the Kingdom of God as opposed to simply keeping things going.

Church will probably not be the same after the pandemic, and as much as we may simply want to get back to normal, that probably won't happen.

In Easingwold and Raskelf we will need to prayerfully and practically support the Vicar, Churchwardens and PCC, as they try to work out what is the right way forward before God. We need to realise that hard decisions may need to be made, and if all we do is criticise those decisions because we don't like them, then it will make a difficult situation even more difficult for the people above to do their work. What we need to do is support, encourage and get behind those called by God to serve in this way within our Benefice.

The Church of the future will inevitably be different in some ways to the Church of the past, but it is also true that there will still be some things that are familiar to us.

A few years ago Easingwold Benefice began to engage with the diocesan initiative 'Leading Your Church Into Growth', or LyCiG as it became known; one thing is very clear about growth and that is simply that growth only comes about through change. This is true in nature, it is true in biology, it is true in family life, it is true in the world of business, and yes – it is also true in the life of the Church.

The pandemic may well be something we wish had never happened – but it has!

What we need to do now, as God's Church, is prayerfully work out what the implications of that pandemic are, both for the future proclamation of the Gospel message in our local community, and also for the working out of God's Kingdom principles here on earth; then once we've worked that out in our local setting, then we need to move forward together - and do it.

## **NHS TEST AND TRACE SCAMS**

Criminals are exploiting the COVID-19 pandemic to try and get their hands on your money and personal information.

The NHS Test and Trace service plays an important role in the fight against Coronavirus and it's vital the public have confidence and trust in the service. However, we understand the concerns people have about the opportunity for criminals to commit scams.

### **What you need to know:**

NHS contact tracers will **only call you from the number 0300 013 5000**. Anyone who does not wish to talk over the phone can request the NHS Test and Trace service to send an email or text instead, inviting them to log into the web-based service.

All text or emails sent by NHS Test and Trace will ask people to sign into the contact tracing website and will provide you with a unique reference number. We would advise people to **type the web address <https://contact-tracing.phe.gov.uk> directly into their browser**, followed by the unique reference number given to you, rather than clicking on any link provided in the message.

### **The NHS Test and Trace service will never:**

- ask you to dial a premium rate number to speak to them (for example, those starting 09 or 087)
- ask you to make any form of payment or purchase a product or any kind
- ask for any details about your bank account
- ask for your social media identities or login details, or those of your contacts
- ask you for any passwords, PINs, or ask you to set up any passwords or PINs over the phone
- ask you to download any software to your PC or ask you to hand over control of your PC, smartphone or tablet to anyone else
- ask you to access any website that does not belong to the government or NHS

# ZOOM

We are now using Zoom so that we can provide an online Sunday service for you. Many of you are already using it and it has been lovely to see you on a Sunday morning.

If you haven't taken the plunge yet and are worried that it will be difficult or that you will be bombarded with emails then don't worry. Tim and I will happily guide you through the process to setup Zoom and give you a practice session so that you can log on for a Sunday morning service.

All that you need to do is download the Zoom app onto your computer, tablet or smart phone. This can be done by going onto your search engine and typing in "Zoom meeting PC". If your computer uses Windows then click on "Download for Windows Zoom".

You will then be given the option to download from the App Store, if using an Apple device; or download from Google Play, if using an Android device. Click on the appropriate one for your computer/phone.

You will then be asked to install "Zoom Cloud Meeting" (the Zoom icon is a blue background with a white video camera)



You will need to create an account. It will ask you to enter your date of birth (this is only to confirm that you are over 18) followed by your email address and then choose a password. You will receive an email confirming your details and it will ask you to activate your account.

Once you have done this, you will be asked to enter your email and passwords to log onto Zoom. Your computer may ask if you want it to remember your password and, if no one else uses your computer, I would suggest clicking "yes".

Zoom will ask if it can use your camera or audio, so you will need to click on Yes/OK for it to work properly.

To keep things secure, each meeting has an ID code and a password. I will send these out a day or two before each Sunday. You will need to enter these numbers when requested.

Tim and I are happy to help you and have a practice session with you. Telephone me on 821394 if you need any help.

I know that other organisations are using Zoom because it allows you to see many people at once and I know of quite a few families who are using it for family quizzes, so I hope that if you do decide to use it, you will find it helpful in other situations.

## A MESSAGE FROM THE HON TREASURER

With the church being closed our weekly income from 'cash on the plate' has fallen away to nothing, so heartfelt thanks are due to those who have arranged to contribute by standing order. For those who haven't yet been able to move forward, such an arrangement can be made with your bank online or by telephone or post, quoting account name "Easingwold and Raskelf PCC", bank sort code 40-20-02 and account number 00322202. Once arranged, please let me know by calling (01347) 239178. This method is usually no more difficult than settling utility bills, and can be for annual, quarterly, or monthly payment.

**Numbered envelopes have not been issued in this financial year because of the risks involved in collecting and counting cash. Please do not use last year's (or earlier) envelopes as changes were made to the numbering system, so your donation will not be shown against your name.**

**If you are saving weekly cash with the intention of donating when the church re-opens, please donate the total by cheque instead. Counting small change is time consuming, open to errors, and not without health risks in this time of virus transmission.**

Have you considered updating the amount of your donations in recent years? Our contribution to Diocesan expenses increases annually, security measures to protect our lead roofs came to £11,000 this year, grounds maintenance is a major expense, and then there's the utility bills to pay. Suffice to say, we still have to pay out even though our income is restricted!

Once again, my thanks to our faithful supporters and also to those who have already signed up to giving by standing order.
