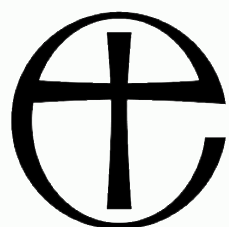

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From Rev'd Richard Grant



Greetings from the Vicarage,

I write this as I approach a couple of weeks of holiday – often a feature of my August. School holidays, my birthday and good weather tend to come together and remind me that it's important to take a break from the regular rhythm of life, and to rest.

Rest is about more than taking time off – from the beginning rest has been a gift from God. From creation, God established a rhythm of work and rest, reminding us that if we would live life to the full, we need to set time aside to pause, to unwind, to regather ourselves, and to renew strength.

Jesus sets that same example. After times of intense ministry, we hear of Jesus withdrawing to quiet places to pray. He invites his disciples to join him in that rest saying, "Come away by yourselves to a remote place and rest a while". Those words are an invitation, born of compassion – rather than a command of obligation, but I think we sometimes need to take them as a command!

Many of us find resting difficult. We live in a world that often celebrates being busy, where there is always more we think we should be doing, there's always another email to read, another demand on our time. True rest is not idleness, and it is nothing to feel guilty about. It's essential for our spiritual lives, as well as our mental and physical health – God invites us to be renewed in body, mind, and spirit.

Perhaps this month you can find moments of rest in simple ways: enjoying a walk in God's creation, sitting quietly with a cup of tea, reading Scripture without rushing, praying in the garden, or simply spending unhurried time with those you love. These ordinary moments can become holy moments when we allow God to meet us there.

The prophet Isaiah reminds us, "In repentance and rest is your salvation, in quietness and trust is your strength". I think it's a beautiful promise for our often hurried lives. As we rest in God, we can discover again that He is the one who sustains us, carries our burdens, and renews our hope.

As a church family, I hope we can also be people who offer rest to others—through kindness, hospitality, encouragement, and listening ears. Sometimes the greatest gift we can give is simply helping someone feel safe, welcomed, and at peace—and able to rest.

Whether you are travelling, staying at home, working as usual, or caring for others, I pray that this August brings opportunities to pause, breathe deeply, and experience the refreshing peace of Christ.

May you know the words of Jesus afresh: "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest."

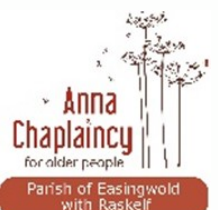
God gave us all these wonderful sounds to help make us aware of the beauty of his creation so

Samaritan's Purse Shoe Box Appeal 2025-26



The following message has been received from Terry, from Samaritan's Purse, who collected our completed shoeboxes from us last year.

"Just a quick one to let you know that the results of Operation Christmas Child 2025-26 are in and the campaign was very successful. A total of 233,844 shoeboxes were collected in UK alone and distributed abroad. Globally Samaritan's Purse collected an impressive 12.2 million. What a blessing, as these shoeboxes brought joy and fulfilled the "Great Commission" - "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations." (Matthew 28)"

The recipients of the boxes are offered the opportunity to learn more about Jesus and many take up this offer and become Christians, but it is not a condition of receiving a box.

This year boxes will again be available in the Parish Church porch, together with an explanatory leaflet, from September. If you are able, please take a box and fill it, before returning it to the Church by early November. Thank you to all who have filled a box in the past and to those filling one for the first time. Your kindness will be so appreciated by the children around the world who receive them.

We swam our hearts out, some took breaks but between us we managed 712 lengths of the pool. We vowed to go back next year to finish the job!!

We have been very appreciative of the many offers of sponsorship and are now collecting it in. As I write we are nearing £1000 with some still to collect.

Praise and Adoration

As long as I have any being, I will sing praises to my God (Psalm 146)

Hallowed be thy name (Lord's Prayer)

To be able to "adore" is certainly one of God's greatest gifts to use, and when we are able to do it, we are momentarily given the experience of love in its selfless, purest, form. Our prayers of praise are of enormous value because they keep us in touch with what is real. For the beauty, love and truth which we praise are what God actually is.

Praise reminds us that we are seeking to be in touch with the very source of eternal wisdom and love. We need to retain our sense of the glory and mystery of God. Our need to adore and revere is an essential part of us – if we no longer find a focus for it in God, we tend to displace it on to other human beings.

Adoration then degenerates into adulation and we begin to "worship" pop stars and political leaders. So praising is an essential activity for us.

Does God need our praise? I think he does, because he knows it is for our sakes, so we can remain in a truthful relationship with him, which results in a mutual exchange of love. Also, if we don't adore and praise God, who will? God is to be praised through all our attitudes and activities, through our whole lives.

Jesus on the eve of his death, prayed for his disciples. "I pray for those you gave me..... and my glory is shown through them." (John 17) Really?! Through those who deserted him, doubted him, asked to be first in his kingdom?

How can we dodge our clear responsibility? We have a vocation to adore him and proclaim his praise.

In today's culture this is an opportunity of being together in a reflective mood including silence. After a brief period of spoken reflection we experience some reflective music. We then enter a period of silent meditation for about 20-25 minutes. Some people use a 4-beat mantra such as 'Ma-ra-na-tha' (or Come Lord Jesus), said twice, (not out loud!) breathing in and then when breathing out. After this, another period of music precedes a final prayer. It doesn't suit everyone but it is something worth trying. Sometimes we have a few comments, even laughter, afterwards! In today's busyness people often find this simple and yet cathartic. Even children in school use silence as a restful experience!
