Not wanting to exclude the groom, the minister offered him a high-five as well and then gave the blessing while the congregation shook with laughter.

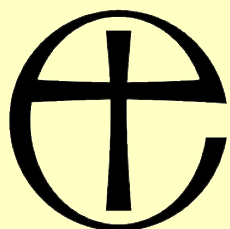
Albert Einstein and his wife were interviewed on their golden wedding. The reporter asked, "To what do you attribute the success of your marriage?"

*From Rev'd Robin Davill*



On the 21<sup>st</sup> of this month we celebrate the feast of St Matthew. According to church tradition he was both an apostle and the author of the gospel that bears his name. His authorship of the gospel is today strongly doubted by most scholars, but his original job of being a tax collector is undoubted and his name of either Matthew or Levi is included in all the gospel lists of the apostles. However apart from these and a short mention of his calling by Jesus we don't know much about him. We know quite a bit more about Zachaeus (another tax collector) but he didn't become an apostle unless the names have got ravelled up. Tax collectors were hated in Israel as traitors working for the occupying Romans, and were also seen as dishonestly profiting off the backs of ordinary people. All of this shows how inflammatory the topic of money can be.

In the Christian tradition wealth is often seen as an impediment to righteousness. Jesus tells the rich and virtuous young man who wishes to join him to give his money away to the poor and that he will have treasure in heaven. However, it all depends on what your treasure consists of, how you go about accumulating it, and what you do with it. If your treasure is monetary and is largely based on activities which are based solely on financial transactions then you are probably Scrooge. Alternatively, if you seldom give a thought about money, spending whenever you feel like it, and hoping things will sort themselves out then you are probably Mr Micawber. As Dickens knew only too well, neither extreme is desirable.

Money of itself is neutral power- it has neither virtue nor vice, but the ends to which it is put have endless possibilities of both of these. Dedicated time, effort, care and love, which are the key to all good relationships, cannot be bought- but a wise use of money can enable us to give these things without placing unnecessary burdens on others, and can exponentially increase their effectiveness. Interestingly Clergy are not paid a salary but a stipend; an allowance so that we can feely exercise our vocations!

If we look at the New Testament there is a clear recognition that all must contribute to the common cause in proportion to their abilities. Mary Magdalene, Joanna the wife of Herod's steward, all assisted Jesus and the apostles. Lydia, the self employed businesswoman dealing in luxury goods (Purple textiles) helps the apostles with money, accommodation, food and space for church meetings. St Paul makes it plain that all must contribute if possible. He was a tent maker by tradition.

Neither wealth nor a relatively modest income are things which we have to remind people of. It is what we do with what we have, both in money and effort, that should speak for us. Remember Jesus' story of the widow's mite. (Mark 21 vs 41-44). And, of course, God has all our bank details anyway.

- ◇ **Sacristy** – ordering essentials by phone (2/3 times a year)
- ◇ **Kitchen/Toilet Overseer** – check cleanliness (between Justin's monthly deep clean), check needs, keep tidy, dispose of recycling, change bin liners if needed
- ◇ **Intercessions** – three more needed (training supplied)
- ◇ **Sunday morning transport** – reserves to help very occasionally,
- ◇ **Social activities** – helping to organise, baking, setting up / clearing up, coffee after 10.30am but also on other occasions e.g. Choral Evensong
- ◇ **Publicity** - when attending a church event, writing a few lines and taking a photo to send to the Advertiser and to the monthly parish magazine, putting up posters
- ◇ **Visiting** – those living alone or who are sick
- ◇ **Christians Together Around Easingwold (CTAE)** – one or more to attend 3 meetings a year, advertise and help at joint events
- ◇ **Flowers** – join the rota – they can be flowers in a vase!
- ◇ **Bell ringing** – you can be taught
- ◇ **Singing** – it is great when we have a choir!

Please come forward to help. Many hands make light work!

John Dunford will be giving what he is aiming to be an entertaining afternoon organ recital at Raskelf on Saturday 27th September at 3.00pm - an hour of music and some commentary in between items.

*In today's culture this is an opportunity of being together in a reflective mood including silence. After a brief period of spoken reflection we experience some reflective music. We then enter a period of silent meditation for about 20-25 minutes. Some people use a 4-beat mantra such as "Ma-ra-na-tha" (or Come Lord Jesus), said twice, (not out loud!) breathing in and then when breathing out. After this, another period of music precedes a final prayer. It doesn't suit everyone but it is something worth trying. Sometimes we have a few comments, even laughter, afterwards! In today's busy-ness people often find this simple and yet cathartic. Even children in school use silence as a restful experience!*

### **Easingwold District Community Care Association**



EDCCA can provide many services such as **befriending and sitting service** for those feeling lonely and to give the carer some brief respite. The **volunteer car scheme** can get you to medical appointments if you are unable to yourself. We also offer minibus trips with Morse.

EDCCA and the villages **Food Bank** can supply food if you have a need. We also collect surplus food from the two Co-ops and hold stalls outside Cozie from Monday to Friday to distribute this.

If you are unable to **collect prescriptions** we have a twice weekly service on Tuesday and Thursdays. We can also do **small shopping requests** for you.

We have our **Dementia Day Centre**, the Hub Club based at the football club.

Our **charity boutique** on Long Street sells a selection of beautiful pre loved items, why not pop in and take a look.

For the men we have a **Men in Sheds** project based at the football club.

Delicious nutritious meals can be ordered via our **Meals on Wheels** service delivered Monday to Friday.

Wheelchairs and other small items can be hired for a nominal fee.

Our **cryptic crossword club** meets on Monday downstairs and the **Knit and Natter group** meets monthly at Springhill Court.

For those wanting to meet others our regular **Tea and Tarts** get together will be on **Tuesday 16th September** in the Galtres Centre between 10am and noon, free to attend, all welcome. Enjoy cakes and tea/coffee.

The trips departing in September are to **Whitby on 4<sup>th</sup> September**. Have a wander by the harbour or visit the museums and independent shops. Don't forget the fish and chips and ice cream. Then on **25<sup>th</sup> September** **Beverley** have a look at St Marys Church, admire the paintings in the art gallery or have a wander around the shops. The cost for both of the trips is £20 per excursion.
