

From the Vicar



"The wolf shall live with the lamb, the leopard shall lie down with the kid, the calf and the lion and the fatling together, and a little child shall lead them."

Isaiah 11:6

This is a time when all on earth shall be at peace with one another, even the wild animals will be in harmony. It sounds idyllic and it is supposed to be. The words were written by Isaiah about a time in the future when a new leader, unlike any other, will be given to us from God. The new leader, Christ, will bring peace for the world. It is thought that the wolves, the leopards and the lions represent large empires whereas the lambs, goats and calves are the defenceless nations who are easy prey for the larger empires.

We could equate Russia and the Ukraine with these images, but they are in a long list of countries that have either been the oppressor or the oppressed. Christ came with the message of peace; it is sad to think that there is still conflict 2000 years later. When will we ever learn? If we ever do learn, we are not listened to, or the next generation has taken over and needs to learn the lesson for themselves.

That does not mean that we should not try. We have quite a few services at the beginning of November, All Saints, All Souls, Armistice and Remembrance, that help us think of those who have gone before us and to thank God for their lives and what was good in their lives. No matter who it is, no one gets though life unscathed, whether it is war or the bully in the playground, we've all been there, being either the wolf or the lamb.

Armistice and Remembrance target our thinking to those who have lost their lives because of war and how we never want it to happen again. All Saints reminds us of the everyday Saints who are Christians going about their daily lives following the example of Christ. All Souls remind us of those whom we love who have died. Each of these services has a different feel and help us to remember people from different perspectives.

It can be quite humbling when I visit families on funeral visits. Some of the stories I hear are of lives well spent, people quietly going around helping others in many different ways. Some of the stories are very funny and remind me that no matter how good people are, there is always a human side to them. When we hear so much doom and gloom on the news, it is lovely to hear these snippets of information where someone's character shines through.

Happy memories are the best, memories that bring smiles to our faces. Those countries at war at this present time probably hold on to these precious happy memories, as it feels as if the lion will never lie down with the lamb but things will change one day. At this time of year we are reminded that things will improve as we see the weather starting to turn cold and the days become darker as we head towards winter, but we know that it is only temporary, it won't be that long before the days become longer and warmer and the sun will shine again.

We have hope in the resurrected Christ, the one who allows the lion and the lamb to lie together. He brought the message of peace so that we could have peace on earth making heaven here on earth. Unfortunately, no matter how much we do, we can only bring a small glimpse of heaven on earth by seeing the good work of humans on this planet. Our ultimate peace will come when we are united with Christ in heaven.





Most Fridays at 2.30 pm to 3.15 pm at the Galtres Centre Function Room (upstairs)

It includes periods of music and silent meditation



In today's culture this is an opportunity of being together in a reflective mood including silence. After a brief period of spoken reflection we experience some reflective music. We then enter a period of silent meditation for about 20-25 minutes. Some people use a 4-beat mantra such as "Ma-ra-na-tha" (or Come Lord Jesus), said twice, (not out loud!) breathing in and then when breathing out.

After this, another period of music precedes a final prayer. It doesn't suit everyone but it is something worth trying. Sometimes we have a few comments, even laughter, afterwards!

In today's busy-ness people often find this simple and yet cathartic. Even children in school use silence as a restful experience!


