

An afternoon of peace and reflection



On Thursday 9th October a group of 18 people visited Ampleforth Abbey. The surrounding valley and Howardian Hills looked superb in the sunshine. The Abbey has stunning architecture, a peaceful atmosphere and beautiful natural grounds It has been home to a community of Benedictine monks since 1802 but whose origins go

further back.. It remains a vibrant, working monastery that extended us a warm welcome .We had a guided tour led by Father Christopher which lasted an hour and a half. He explained how the abbey building developed, the normal day's routine for a monk and told us the lengthy process followed by anyone seeking to join the Order.

It was interesting to learn that the Abbey Church was designed by Sir Giles Gilbert Scott (famous for Liverpool Anglican Cathedral and the red telephone box.!) and contained extensive oak furniture by Robert 'Mouseman' Thompson. We looked closely for his signature carved mouse on the various pieces.

It was a lovely informative afternoon out, in good company, peaceful surroundings and crowned by a visit to the Abbey Tearoom to indulge in a variety of excellent homemade cakes!

It was very pleasing to see that for a few people, it was the first time they had come to a YOU and ME event.. We hope you will join us again. All are welcome.






Anna Chaplaincy – What is it?

It includes periods of music and silent meditation



In today's culture this is an opportunity of being together in a reflective mood including silence. After a brief period of spoken reflection we experience some reflective music. We then enter a period of silent meditation for about 20-25 minutes. Some people use a 4-beat mantra such as "Ma-ra-na-tha" (or Come Lord Jesus), said twice, (not out loud!) breathing in and then when breathing out. After this, another period of music precedes a final prayer. It doesn't suit everyone but it is something worth trying. Sometimes we have a few comments, even laughter, afterwards! In today's busy-ness people often find this simple and yet cathartic. Even children in school use silence as a restful experience!
